Part B - Kaitautoko

Each pilgrim on a Three-day Cursillo is supported in prayer and through helpful action by a veteran Cursillista who knows the process and how to assist it. This person is their Kaitautoko. Normally the relationship between Pilgrim and Kaitautoko is one-on-one.

You being Clergy, the Bishop is your Kaitautoko, as for every other Clergy Pilgrim. To carry out those responsibilities (you’ll see them listed below) the Bishop has bestowed the privilege of carrying out the more mechanical elements upon me. Specifically:

For a Lay Pilgrim	For a Clergy Pilgrim
Kaitautoko explains the Cursillo method and experience	As for Lay Pilgrim
Kaitautoko undertakes to pray for the Pilgrim in the days before, during and after the Three-day Cursillo	As for Lay Pilgrim
Kaitautoko looks after the Pilgrim’s family: babysitting, meals, sports appearances etc as needed, while the Pilgrim is away from home	Kaitautoko and Clergy together find solutions for Clergy duties whilst the Clergy are away from the Parish
Kaitautoko takes responsibility for transporting Pilgrim to the Cursillo venue on Thursday by 5pm, and returning them home when the Cursillo closes on Sunday around 5pm.	Kaitautoko can take responsibility for transportation of Clergy to the venue; or Clergy have the Bishop’s approval to use Clergy cars

Being Clergy on Cursillo.

Anglican Cursillo is fuelled and energised by Lay Anglicans. From the beginning of the weekend be humbly open in disclosing that you are Clergy and a fellow pilgrim. Like the rest of the Cursillo community, you are seeking to experience Cursillo and to strengthen and extend your discipleship.

Some of the experiences that Cursillo offers to Lay people will echo parts of your own journey toward ordination. Give thanks for those parallel experiences.
